That being said, all of us still at times feel like we’re “running around like a chicken with its head cut off.” Ever felt that way? ☺ We get one thing accomplished and realize there’s a list of 20 or so other things that need to be done as well. ***Not one of us is complaining, mind you – it’s exciting to be part of what the Lord is doing among us!***

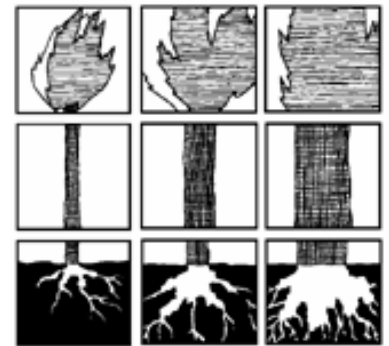
One of the main ways we are working to manage the growth is to be crystal clear about each of our responsibilities. Our Staff-Parish Relations Team (SPRC) has been busy formalizing job descriptions for each staff member so that as each one of us is faithful in our tasks, the “common

good” referenced above is impacted for Kingdom purposes. Our team meets once a month for prayer, discussion, training, and coordination. I consistently remind us that as ***each*** of us is faithful, ***all*** of us are faithful.

In addition to this monthly meeting, Sam (our associate pastor) and I meet weekly to pray, discuss and plan for the various aspects of our life together. One of the main things we talk about is YOU – the

people of Christ Church. We talk about what’s happening in your lives – blessings and challenges – and how we as your pastors can respond in ways that are helpful, caring, and Christ-

like. Needless to say, the pastoral responsibilities for a congregation the size we are becoming are significant. Sam and I – with SPRC’s help and approval – have ordered these responsibilities so that all of them can be cared for in the most effective way possible.



GROWTH

You will find in the pages that follow my job description, as well as Sam’s job description. I encourage you to review them and see how we have assigned the various pastoral tasks.

In the months that follow we will share one-by-one the program team's job descriptions so that you can be familiar with who-does-what in our life together.

I write these words on Wednesday of Holy Week. Palm Sunday has just occurred with almost 500 people in worship. Any time a church experiences the kind of growth we are in at this moment there are **"growing pains:"** We have to share the facility in much more creative ways now; we have to park a distance away and maybe change where we sit in the sanctuary so that new folks can have a place and the opportunity to worship with us; we don't know every one's name the way we used to; there's no room to sit in some of our Sunday School classes, not to mention one class that doesn't even have a consistent room!; it's hard to make our way through the hallways on Sunday mornings now because of all the people; and more people means more program needs and opportunities - as well as additional qualified staff to lead them - which results in challenges to finance it all.

I think what happened to the early church could be happening here. We – like them – are striving to focus on the things God says are important, and in response God is adding to our number as he did to theirs. Kingdom things are happening among us, sisters and brothers, rejoice! And remember, the God who calls us to Kingdom work has all of the resources needed to accomplish what he calls us to do!

Job Descriptions

Christ United Methodist Church Lead Pastor- Position Description

Qualifications & Expectations

- Will be committed to Jesus Christ as **Lord** of their life and will be able to articulate their faith journey.
- Will model the Christian lifestyle to others and personally seek to live out the purpose of Christ Church.
- Will be eager and able to work with a team of people in ministry (other staff and persons) to reach the overall goals of the congregation.
- Will be strongly self-motivated and directed, and possess strong organizational skills.
- Will be flexible and have the ability to adjust to last minute changes.
- Will possess valid driver's license.

Responsibilities:

1. Primary responsibility for the pulpit ministry of Christ Church with a minimum of 46 preaching Sundays plus Christmas Eve each year. Recognized use of major blocks of time for preparation of this pulpit ministry. Responsible for pulpit supply during vacations and other times away.
2. Oversee the ministry and mission of Christ Church - working to ensure faithfulness to the church's purpose of loving God, loving people, and making disciples for Jesus Christ - utilizing the gifts of staff and lay leadership, providing periodic reports to Church Council and Charge Conference.
3. General oversight of Christ Church staff through (a) developing and maintaining position descriptions in consultation with staff members and SPRC, (b) annual reviews in relation to the purpose of the church and the position descriptions, (c) recommending changes, reallocation, dismissals, or additions to staff through SPRC, (d) periodic development of salary recommendations for all staff through SPRC, (e) advising and approving plans for staff continuing education, and (f) providing resources and support for staff care and morale.
4. Assist with direct congregational care in partnership with the Associate Pastor and the Care Team which can include but not be limited to first-time-attender contacts, consultation and counseling with church members and persons from the community within schedule limitations, weddings, baptisms, funerals/memorial services, and hospital calls as needed.
5. Teach short term Bible studies/classes as part of the church's overall discipleship design.
6. Provide guidance, training, and resources to Christ Church's primary administrative teams (Church Council, Trustees, Finance Team, Staff-Parish Team, Lay Leadership Team) and to other ministry teams as needed and/or requested.

Line of Accountability:

The Lead Pastor is ultimately accountable to the presiding Bishop and his/her local representative (District Superintendent), and then to the Staff-Parish Relations Team.

Associate Pastor- Position Description

Qualifications & Expectations

- Will be committed to Jesus Christ as **Lord** of their life and will be able to articulate their faith journey.
- Will model the Christian lifestyle to others and personally seek to live out the purpose of Christ Church.
- Will be eager and able to work with a team of people in ministry (other staff and persons) to reach the overall goals of the congregation.
- Will be strongly self-motivated and directed, and possess strong organizational skills.
- Will be flexible and have the ability to adjust to last minute changes.
- Will possess valid driver's license.

Responsibilities:

7. Recruit, lead, train, resource and evaluate a team of persons to provide excellent caring ministries to and with the congregation. This includes hospital and parish visitation, follow-up care after hospitalization or illness, respite-care, funeral meals and grief care and other things that share the compassionate love of Christ with persons in the church family who are hurting or in need. It also includes opportunities for fellowship where persons across the age spectrum can connect with each other and build strong Christ-centered relationships.
8. Recruit, lead, train, resource, and evaluate a team of persons to enable new people to be assimilated gently and effectively into the life and ministry of the church. This includes first-time attender follow-up, fellowship activities designed to welcome new and/or seeking persons, responsibility for "Intro to Christ Church" gatherings in preparation for church membership and other new ministries as needed.
9. Primary responsibility for the worship and music life of the congregation. This includes facilitating a team of persons to prayerfully evaluate and care for the logistical elements of our worship life; providing leadership at worship experiences; providing spiritual and musical direction to the Chancel Choir and Praise Team; coordinating seasonal musicals designed to engage the gifts of members, disciple participants, and reach out to the community; and develop other music and worship ministries as the Holy Spirit leads.
10. Provide coverage for lead pastor responsibilities as needed and or directed.

Line of Accountability:

The Associate Pastor is ultimately accountable to the presiding Bishop and his/her local representative (District Superintendent), and then to the Staff-Parish Relations Team.

A man walking by took a few coins from his pocket and dropped them into the hat. He then took the sign, turned it around, and wrote some words. He put the sign back so that everyone who walked by would see the new words.

Soon the hat began to fill up. A lot more people were giving money to the blind boy.

That afternoon, the man who had changed the sign came to see how things were. The boy recognized his footsteps and asked, "Were you the one who changed my sign this morning? What did you write?"

The man said, "I only wrote the truth. I said what you said but in a different way."
What he had written was: "Today is a beautiful day and I cannot see it."

Do you think the first sign and the second sign were saying the same thing? Of course both signs told people the boy was blind. But the first sign simply said the boy was blind. The second sign told the people they were lucky that they were not blind. Should we be surprised that the second sign was more effective?

MORAL of the story: "Be thankful for what you have. Think differently and positively.

Live life with no excuses and love with no regrets.

When life gives you a 100 reasons to cry, show life that you have 1000 reasons to smile.

Face your past without regret. Handle your present with confidence. Prepare for the future without fear. Keep the faith and drop the fear.

The most beautiful thing is to see a person smiling. And even more beautiful is knowing that you are the reason behind it!!!!

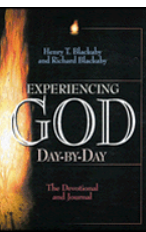

Taking this course has helped me to know that God will pursue me, not only with His love, but will pursue us when He wants us to do something. Relationship with God is more important than anything we can do for Him. It is real and personal and very important to God. Our relationship with Him determines how much He is able to use us and our faith in Him. Some of these I already knew but was reminded in a big way. Crisis of belief and God pursuing us when He wants us to do something was really the most important to me. I learned much from those teachings. I had really been seeking God on what to do and how to do it, etc. Knowing God will pursue us when He wants us to do something helped me to relax and enjoy my relationship with Him more.

It is a whole new way of looking at life. I am understanding that a love relationship with God is more important than any other single factor in my life. When I am obedient I will "Experience God" and then people around me will know more of God because of my faith and trust in His plans, His purposes, and His ways.



The fact that God wants to pursue a loving and personal relationship with me is awesome. It has helped me see how this relationship develops and has just clarified some things for me. I've also appreciated the relationships with friends at the table.

Neither my experiences or what "I think" God is saying (emotions) should be my daily guide. I must allow the events in my life to be understood and interpreted by the scriptures because what God reveals to me in the scriptures is never wrong. My prayer life must be a two-way conversation. I speak and I need to allow time for God to speak to me and make changes in my life according to God's will.

EXPERIENCING GOD'S

In this particular week, our group is seeing god's hand in three different situations we have been in prayer for. This is more than a study; it is an eye-opening experience to the love relationship our Lord pursues from us. There have been numerous encounters with God since beginning the study. The study is not a formula but rather a continuance and encouragement built from a heart-felt desire to experience God. The study prepares your heart and mind so that you can experience God through your close loving relationship (with Him). Even I, myself, have experienced a direct encounter with God through scriptures linking together spiritual markers in my life. I will forever be changed because God is revealing to me the vast scope of the relationship He desires.

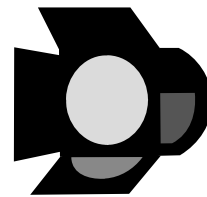

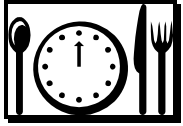

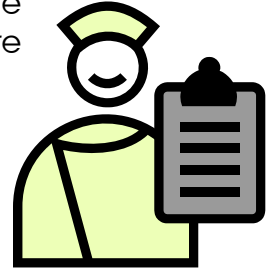
GALATIAN GIRLS PM

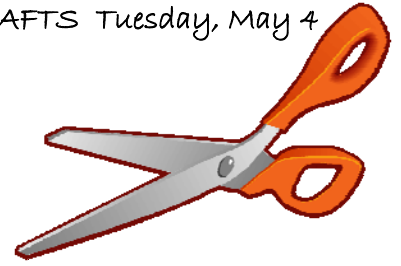

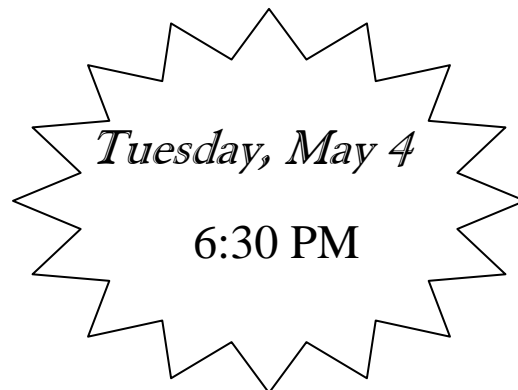

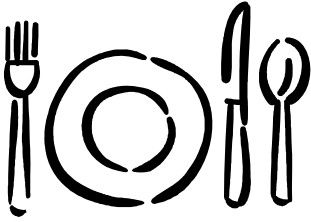
