"Love God, Love People, Make Disciples for Jesus Christ"

From the Associate Pastor

The lyrics of a popular song titled, "If We Are the Body," which hit the charts a couple of years ago, call us to remember what we are about as the Church – the Body of Christ. According to the song, we, the Church, are His arms, His hands, His words, His feet, and His love revealed. As I filter those words through the life of Christ Church, I am grateful to be reminded of what we are called to be – and also what we have been privileged to do. It has been said often this year and even more in the recent days that we have experienced the Body of Christ in action through acts of love for God and people. A review of the past year brings to mind many ways in which, together, God has allowed our people to truly be His reaching arms, healing hands, teaching words, going feet, and His love.

With no intention of trying to capture everything that has taken place, may I give you a summary of some things that have taken place over the past year that have focused on local opportunities to care for one another, both physically and spiritually?

- ✚ Bi-weekly morning & evening Bible studies coordinated by the Women's Ministries took place, ministering to the spiritual needs of our women, and providing a place and connection for those new to our fellowship and the unchurched. These ministries combined were attended by over 50 per week at optional sessions, providing nurture and spiritual discipleship.
- ✚ The monthly Kitchen Kreations has provided a welcoming forum enabling members and new attendees to feel connected and to develop friendships. It has proven to be a ministry where individuals from the ABC Pregnancy Center, for example, and other local groups, have been able to feel safe and included, while working on life-skill development. This has averaged 20 people per month and has proven to be an effective opportunity to experience the love of God's people.

Spa Night – 25 individuals were given assistance on ways to take care of themselves outwardly and inwardly, as well as receive instruction of personal financial management.

- ✚ Final Fridays are Free began in May. This monthly event, sponsored by the Women's Ministry, provided hot meals to approximately 500 individuals from the church and community, while offering a place for them to sit with others and share in conversation and fellowship.
- ✚ The Winter Clothing Giveaway has successfully reached out with arms of love and warmth to over 200 individuals from our community and family, helping fulfill many basic clothing needs.
- ✚ Knotty Ladies, a mission outreach to those in

need of comfort, warmth and love has included partnering with the International Order of Rainbow Girls to make 18 lap robes for residents of the Wesbury Home in Meadville, and later following up with an additional 31 lap robes to the Wesbury. 25 quilts were made and delivered to the AARP office to be distributed to children in hospitals, and a goal of making and delivering 25 quilts, along with soap, shampoo and other personal items to the Women's Crisis Center in Oil City was completed.

- ✚ Dignity for Decent Housing, an outreach sponsored by Christ United Methodist Church for the purpose of providing a safe and accessible environment for those in need, undertook projects including the replacement of a sidewalk for one of the church members, the

replacement of front steps for an elderly woman in the community, and replacement of rear steps in the home of three widows living several blocks from the church.

- ✚ Men's Ministries have served 38 with the Free Oil Change ministry, 25 average at weekly Bible Studies, assisted with the moving of three families and built a new sidewalk for a family in need. Additionally 20 or more guys assisted the Salvation Army with bell ringing during the Christmas season and an average of 25 men were ministered to at monthly breakfasts.
- ✚ The combined efforts of the Care and Women's Ministries to those sick or homebound has include the delivery of Hospitality Baskets throughout the year and the delivery of over 100 floral arrangements to sick or homebound.
- ✚ Additionally, Care ministries in the areas of visitation, hospitality and nurturing have included approximately 100 personal contacts with first time worshipers, over 300 visits to hospital, nursing home, and homebound residents, no less than 200 cards of encouragement sent, eight (8) funeral dinners serving 320 people. Six (6) after-worship fellowship times took place for the purpose of assimilating members and welcoming the new.
- ✚ A more comprehensive Greeter Ministry is underway with a mission of hospitality to our worshipers. Presently, over 20 individuals have said "yes" to the call to be a presence of hospitality to worshipers, including our many visitors.
- ✚ Another Care ministry has included a new Senior Day Out luncheon, which has resulted in the opportunity to provide 45 luncheon meals and monthly opportunities for seniors to enjoy a meal together with peer-to-peer fellowship, worship, resource sharing and entertainment.
- ✚ In an effort to reach out to individuals and families who would benefit from either long-term or short-term provisions of food, several ministries combined have provided over 125 meals.

Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers.

Galatians 6:10

- ✚ And although in its infancy, a ministry to provide the Sacrament of Holy Communion to the homebound and shut-ins served 35 individuals through a new team now consisting of 15 servers.





This list could go on. In fact, my original draft included an additional full page but had to be abbreviated. These examples do not begin to capture clearly the partnerships developed with community programs such as the aforementioned ABC Pregnancy Center and the American Red Cross, and the Meals on Wheels, Salvation Army and others. Other partnerships included those with the Even Start Program and the Child Development Center, all providing a way to be the presence of Christ and His hands and feet in the lives of children, adults and families. The latter helped facilitate the provision of lunches to over 230 children throughout the summer.

Why do we do what we do - and why do we take the time to review and reflect? I suggest that we are compelled to do what we do because Christ has loved us first and has now called us to be His Body in the world, and we do what we do in order to be the Body at work -reaching, healing, teaching, going and showing. We should take the time occasionally to review it because we are accountable to one another as we work together for a common mission of care, nurture and love. And we must take the time to review in order to evaluate how we are doing, and then strive to reach further, heal more, teach better, go stronger and love more visibly.

In conclusion, I cannot overlook the convergence of all of the above ministries into a common mission of love towards the individual families impacted by the recent tragedy and loss of lives, and a community touched by grief. It is not necessary to enumerate the meals served, hugs given, prayers offered, tears of compassion shed, and words of hope spoken. What we can say is this; the church was the Body of Christ and it responded because it was willing, ready, and above all, equipped through sensitivity from the Holy Spirit, and the continual practice of serving others. In 2010, let's be watching for opportunities for both outreach – and inreach.

Bring ideas with you of projects, crafts, cooking, etc., that you would like to suggest for Spring.

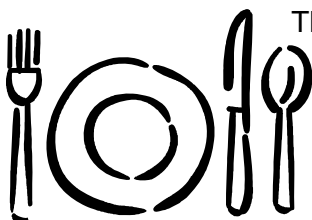

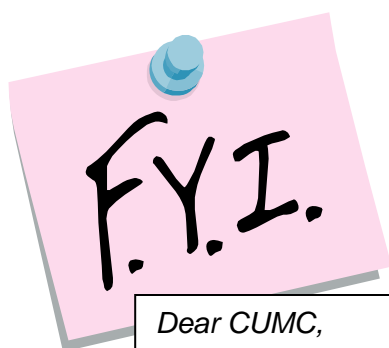
